


When it comes to boarding, we have the experience... over 150 years and counting

Part boarding



Part boarding gives a flexibility that may suit your needs

If your child is not yet ready for full boarding, we offer a part boarding option.

Part boarding allows pupils (FY Year 9 and Remove Year 10) to board up to three set nights a week. You can also make use of our extended day offer, whereby your child may join the house from 7.30am and stay until 9.30pm, alongside their overnight stays. With a busy school schedule and opportunities to fill the extended day with the many co-curricular and super-curricular activities.

Integrating themselves into the Malvern community, even on a partial basis, allows your child to reap the benefits of boarding; we provide a safe familiar home base. Whether it's joining friends for early morning breakfast or staying for drama rehearsals, each house door is open.

Additional boarding nights can be booked on a per night basis.

Day pupils

Everyone is welcome, everyone is part of it, everyone is at home.

At Malvern we offer a community experience whether your child full boards, part boards or just comes for the day.

Our day pupils are fully integrated into the houses alongside our boarding pupils, and are an integral part of our thriving community. They can access all the benefits of boarding; including extending the day where pupils can join the house from 7.30am and stay until 9.30pm.

Our day option also includes 15 nights of boarding per academic year allowing you to be flexible where you need to and also allowing your child to experience all the joys and enrichment of boarding at Malvern when they need to. These may include taking part in House Singing, social events, lectures and concerts.

Additional boarding nights can also be booked at a per night rate.


