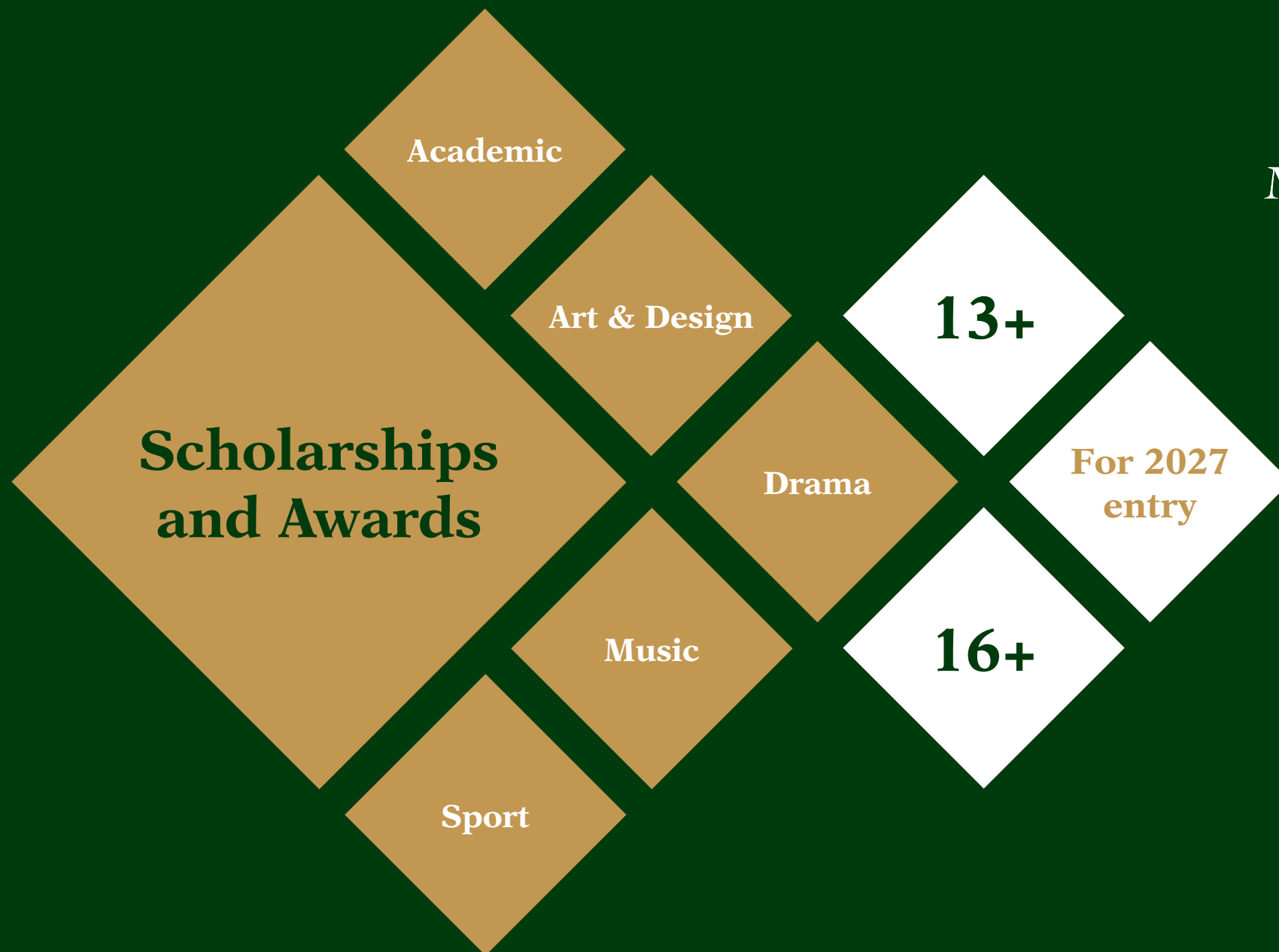

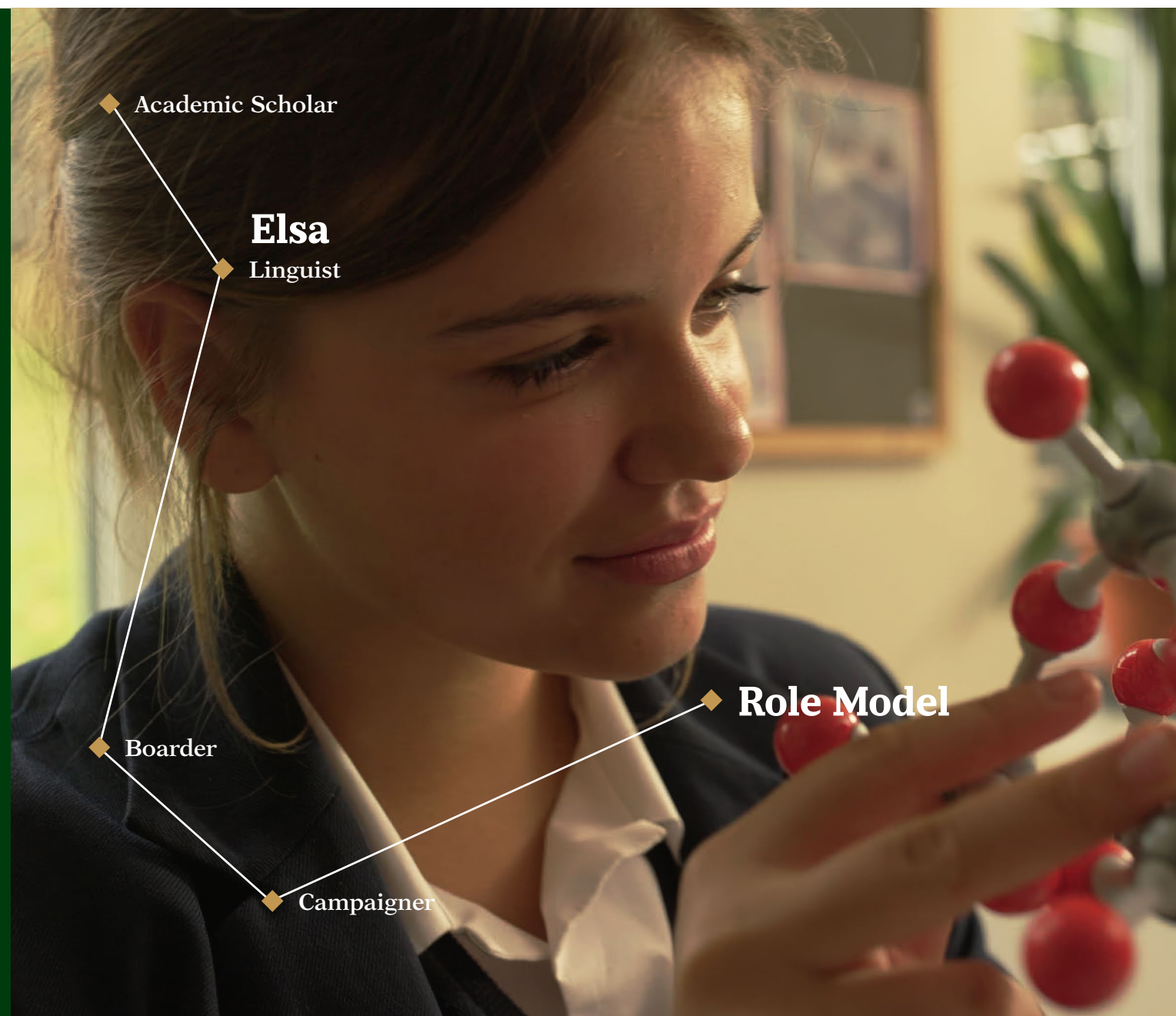
Internal Scholarship Applications

Pupils applying for the Common Academic Scholarship at 13+ should be inspired by learning, not just in the classroom but also beyond.

Scholars are expected to work outside of their comfort zone, thinking creatively and with a thirst for knowledge.

Scholars will be active members of the academic group, the Aston Society, and our 'Stretch and Challenge' programme, and will regularly attend academic lectures and extension events.

Candidates will be required to come to Malvern College for two days of assessment. Each candidate will sit compulsory papers in English and Mathematics. There will be assessed practical tasks for Science, as well as an interview and collaborative project.

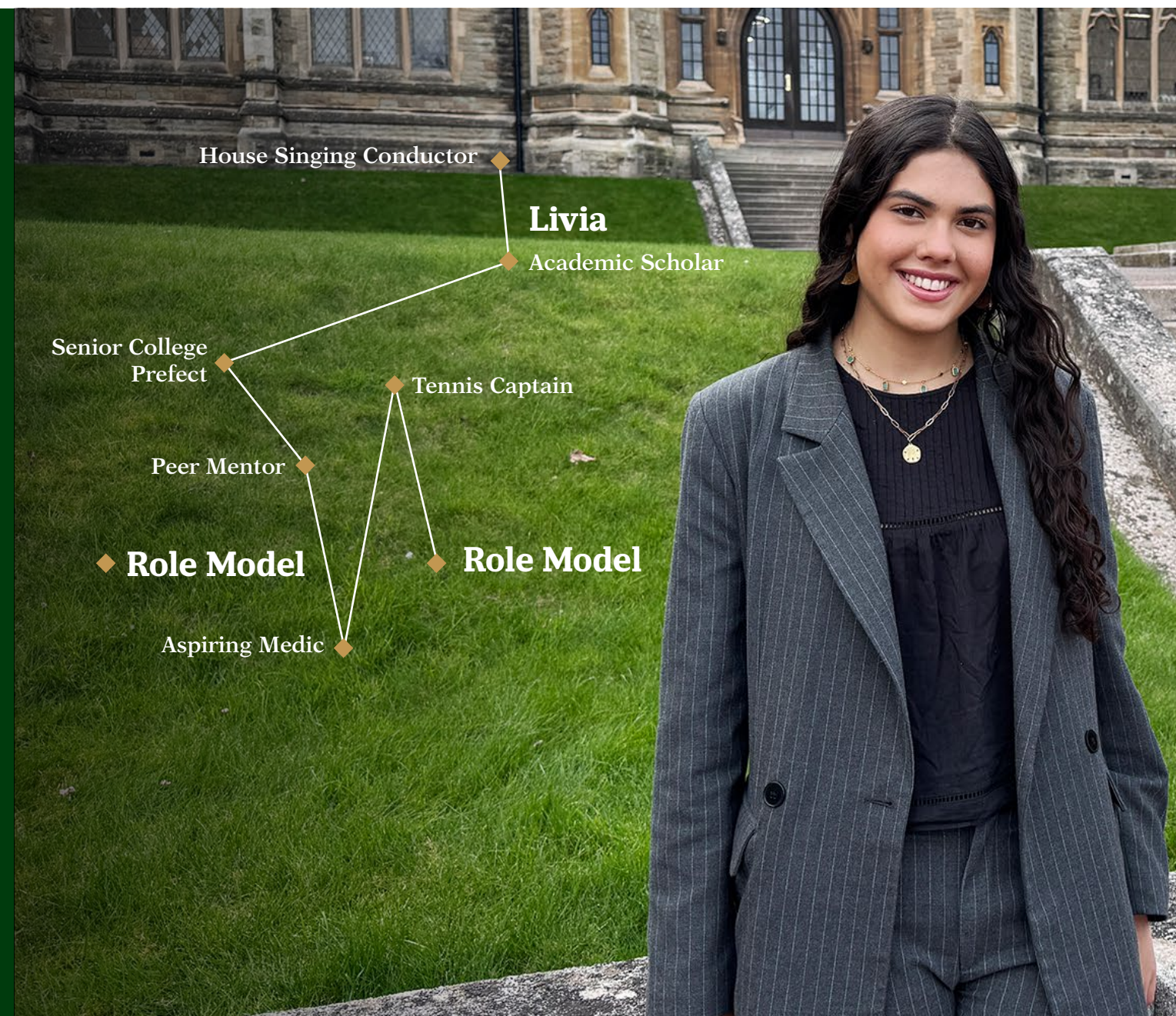
- **English examination.**

As part of our 16+ scholarships, Malvern College offers the following named awards:

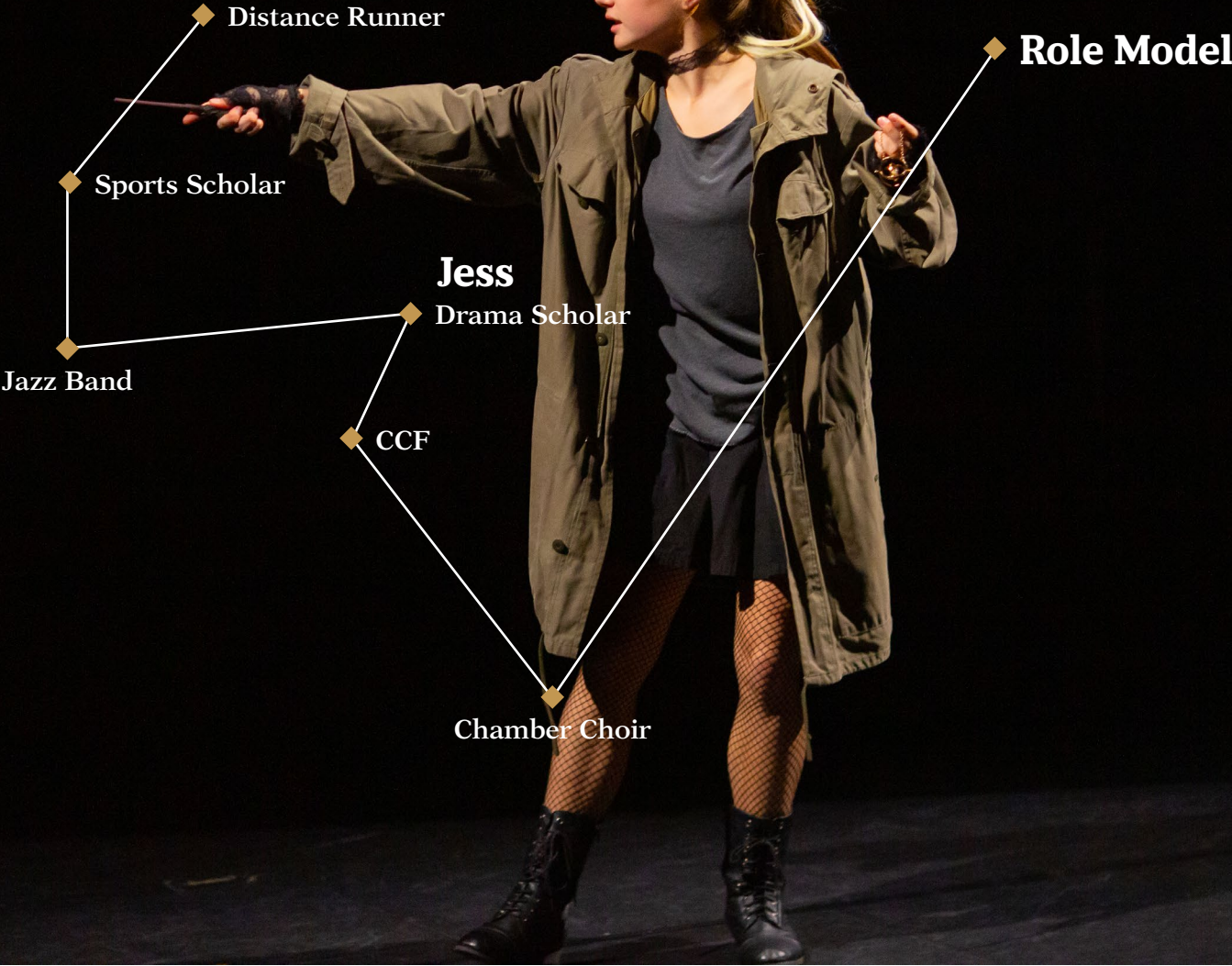
- The **Clark Scholarship** is awarded in recognition of the outstanding contribution of our former Headmaster (Mr Antony Clark) and aims to offer a transformational experience to the award holder. The Clark Scholarship creates an opportunity for a pupil who is academically strong, intellectually curious and who will make the most of the many opportunities Malvern College has to offer
- The **Alan Duff Scholarship** for exceptional all-round academic ability
- The **Francis Aston Scholarship** for Science. Candidates must commit to studying at least two science subjects at A Level or at Higher Level IB, and will be expected to take a lead role in scientific debate and in super-curricular activities such as the Lucretian Society
- The **Malvernian Society Award** specifically for external candidates entering the Sixth Form from the state sector.

Drama Scholarships 13+/16+

Opportunities:

- Attend masterclasses and workshops
- Attend a range of theatre and performance trips throughout the year
- Discover their talents and expertise in the world of theatre
- Expert advice applying to related university courses and regional/national theatre companies

Scholars are expected to display a strong interest in Drama and Theatre and be able to demonstrate a significant ability as a stage actor or musical theatre performer or theatre technician.

Assessment will take the form of three tasks:

- an audition
- an improvisation workshop
- the writing of a personal statement.

For the audition, acting candidates will be asked to present a monologue of their choice which should be approximately two to three minutes in length (three minutes for 16+ entry). If desired, candidates are also invited to perform a musical theatre song. This is not a compulsory part of the assessment, but an optional element for those who wish to showcase their talents.

If selected, the song should be approximately 2–3 minutes in length, and the backing track must be provided to Malvern College in advance of the assessment day. All candidates are advised to prepare a portfolio chronicling their involvement in dramatic and performance activities.

We are looking for imagination, initiative, inspiration and enthusiasm from candidates who will be able to exhibit a genuine passion for theatre as live entertainment, flair in presenting characters of style, a stage presence, an awareness of the theatrical process and leadership skills in terms of directing others.

Our Scholars will support the department wholeheartedly, attend and lead theatrical workshops and attend productions as part of the Front of House team.

Design and Technology Scholars will be able to help lead small groups of pupils working on specific projects as well as developing their own ideas. Scholars must play an active role in the department and be fine ambassadors for the subject at all times both in and outside of the classroom. They will play a key role in the preparation of competitions, and, in return, receive expert support and will be taught by world-leading artists, designers and craft specialists and practitioners.

Scholars must be able to work equally well collaboratively as they do independently and show a thirst for working outside of their comfort zone in many areas of the subject. Scholars are expected to be able to communicate clearly and maturely, reflect critically on their work, and should possess first-class problem-solving skills.

The scholarship assessment will consist of three main components:

- work carried out before the exam
- a practical examination designed to test the pupil's knowledge, imagination and communication (for 13+ entry)
- an interview with the Head of Design and Technology as well as with teaching staff within the department

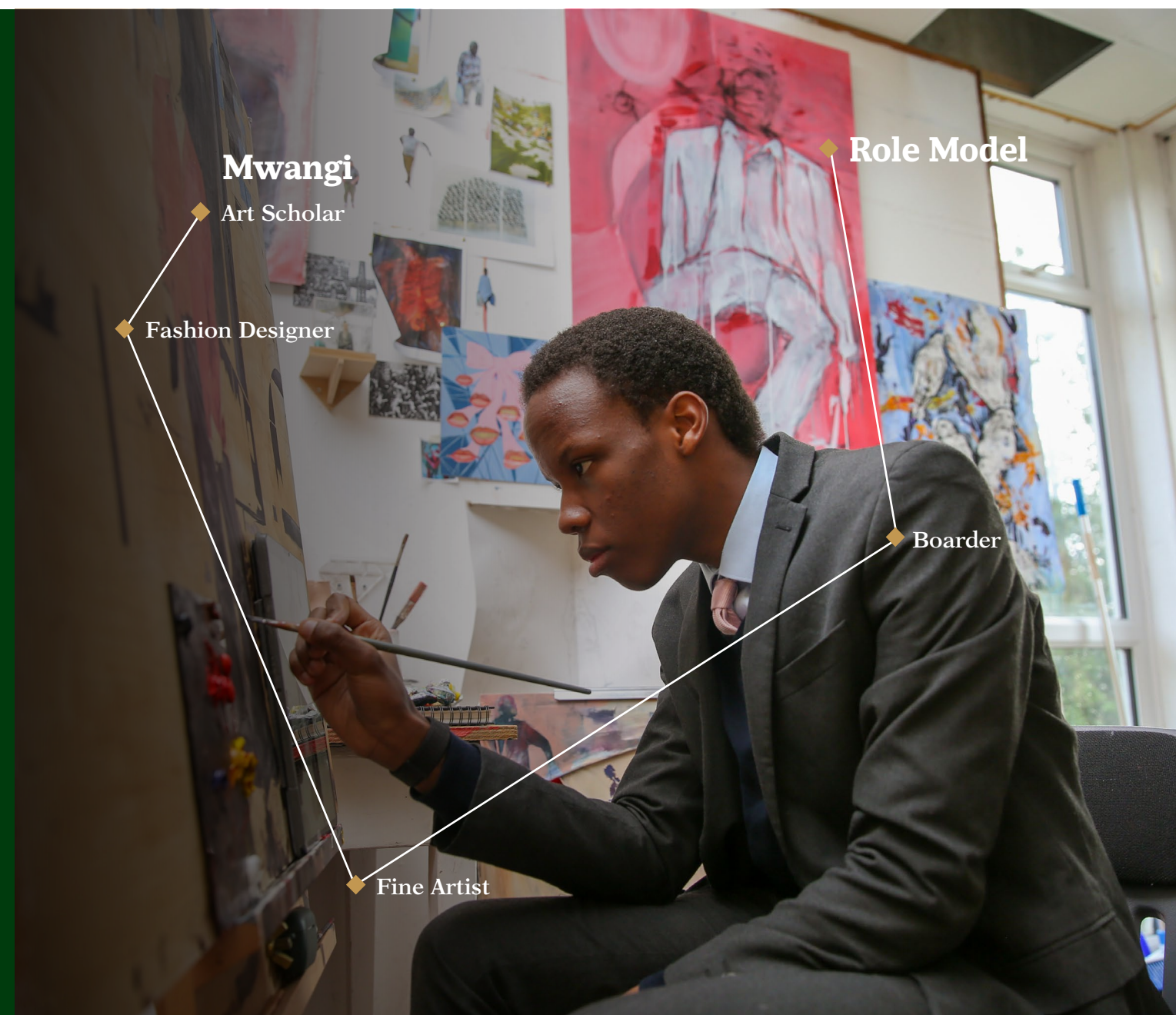

Art Scholarships 13+/16+

Art Scholars must demonstrate their flair and passion for a range of techniques and skills within the discipline. It is expected that Art Scholars play an active role in the Art department and will have the opportunity to present their work at Art events.

Scholars will be able to take an active role in promoting artistic awareness within the College and will be regular visitors to the Lindsay Art Centre, developing their own ideas and providing images for publications, competitions, plays and exhibitions. They should be leaders amongst their peers and have a real interest in the visual arts. They will be encouraged to take part in competitions and their attendance at lectures from visiting artists will be expected. There will be opportunities to spend time with the Artist in Residence to discuss their opinions and inspirations.

The scholarship assessment process will consist of three main components:

- practical tasks: candidates will be required to draw a range of still lifes, each with different media (for 13+ entry)
- portfolio: candidates should provide a portfolio consisting of no more than ten pages/slides illustrating their passion for the subject
- interview: this will be an informal discussion with the Head of Art about a selected piece of work from the candidate's portfolio

Photography Scholarships 13+/16+

Photography Scholars will be keen to experiment and learn about traditional, as well as contemporary, digital photographic processes, and will work equally well collaboratively as they do independently. They will be expected to communicate clearly and maturely, reflect critically on their work, and should possess first-class problem-solving skills. Attendance at weekly Photography Activities is expected and Scholars are invited to lectures from visiting photographers, artists and industry specialists.

Candidates will be assessed in the following manner:

- practical tasks: photograph a range of subjects including abstract images of ordinary objects, exploring placement and light
- portfolio: candidates should provide a portfolio consisting of 10-20 images illustrating their passion for the subject
- interview: this will be an informal discussion with the Head of Photography about their work

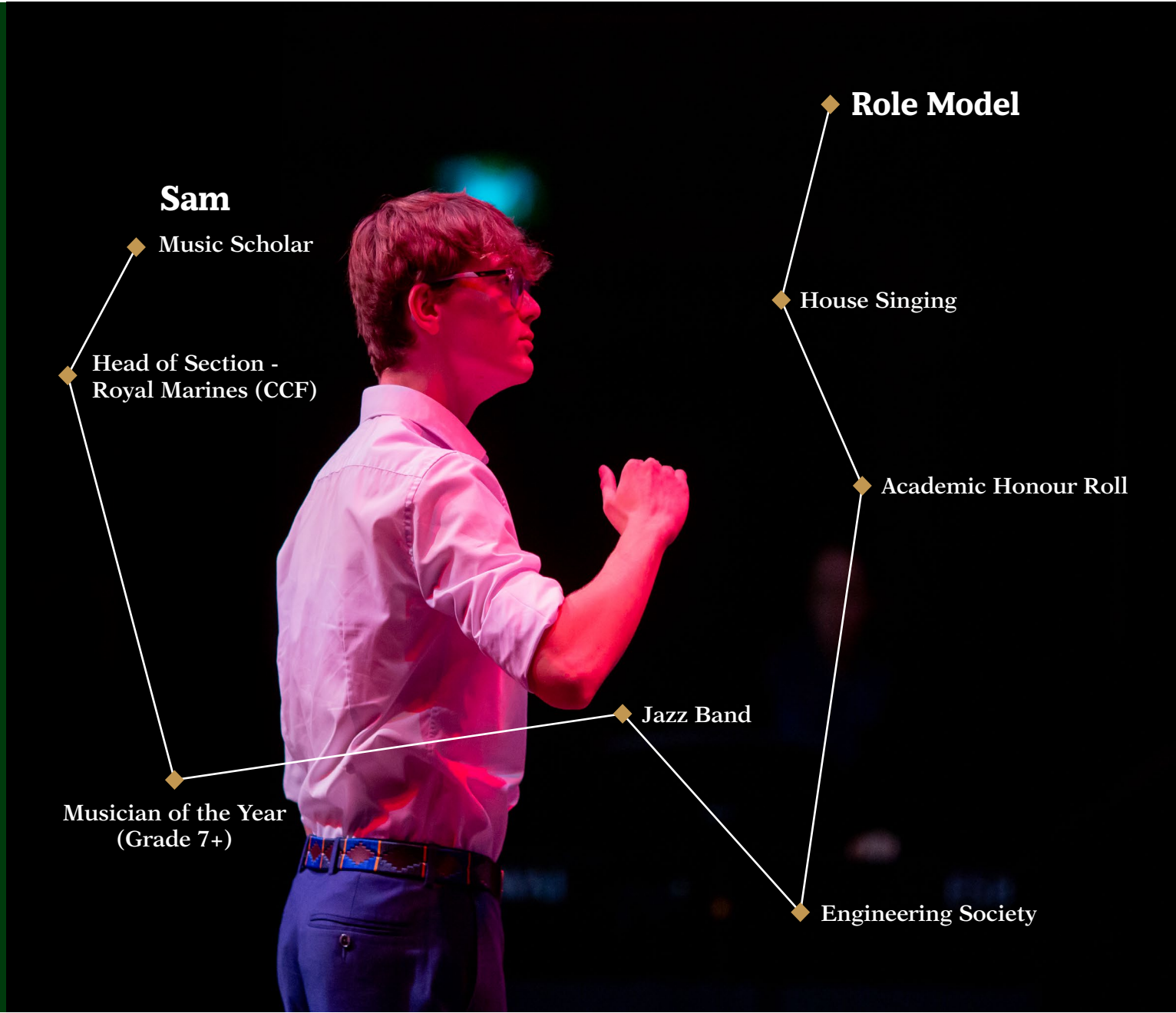

Prospective candidates are encouraged to contact the Director of Performing Arts to arrange a pre-scholarship consultation.

Music Scholars will automatically become part of an exciting programme for musicians. They play a full part in the musical life of the school and will have individual lessons within the Music Department of the College. Scholars should be role models to their peers and engage in all that the music department promotes.

It is expected that 13+ award holders will take the Music GCSE examination given that the levels of performance that the candidates are likely to have achieved correlate directly with the performance requirements of the GCSE. Candidates would normally have reached the equivalent of a good Grade 5 (ABRSM or Trinity) standard on at least one instrument or singing and be able to show general musicality equal to their technical ability.

16+ scholars would normally have reached the equivalent of a good Grade 7 plus a Grade 5 in their second study. Scholarship auditions include the performance of two contrasting pieces on the candidate's first study instrument and at least one piece on each other instrument offered. Scales and arpeggios from the last grade taken will also be tested.

In addition, a piece of music equivalent to the last grade taken on the first study, is sent to the candidate a week in advance of the audition for them to learn and perform, possibly as part of an ensemble - this is in lieu of sight-reading. There will also be ear tests to assess the candidate's aural acuity. It should be noted that a good singing voice would be a strong additional recommendation. The candidates will be interviewed by the Director of Performing Arts and other members of the Music Department.

Parents and schools are asked to note that the school follows the MMA Code of Practice which is designed to ensure fairness and transparency in the scholarship process.

Opportunities for Sports Scholars:

Talented Athlete Programme

Malvern College is committed to providing opportunities for gifted pupils to excel in sport. The Talented Athlete Programme (TAP) is accessible for those pupils who have received a Sports Scholarship or Sports Exhibition and sets out to identify talent, and then develop this through structured curriculum based and extra-curricular activities.

Sports Scholarship 13+

We offer both named and general awards for our major sports – cricket, rugby, hockey, netball and football. These scholarships are designed to support talented athletes who demonstrate excellence and potential in one or more of these sports.

If you have a child who has talent in another sport, please do speak to us about how we will be able to support them during their time with us. We don't offer Scholarships for sports other than the ones listed above. All Sports Scholars are expected to be fully committed to sport at the College and to exercise leadership skills both on and off the field of play. They will be excellent role models for all Malvern College pupils and will also demonstrate the highest level of sportsmanship. It is expected that Sports Scholars will show a sustained commitment to sport throughout their time at the College.

It should be noted that we recognise that pupils' attitudes towards, and development in, sport will change over time, and therefore we will review the progress of the Scholars regularly to help them navigate their chosen path.

Junior Levick Award

This scholarship will be awarded to a boy and girl entering Year 9 with a proven record of high performance and potential who has represented their county, region or indeed their country in at least one or more of our main sports: rugby, hockey, cricket, football, netball (although excellence in other sports may be considered).

Worcestershire Cricket Scholarship

A 13+ award, this scholarship is awarded in partnership with Worcestershire CCC who select players for Malvern College to assess. This is a prestigious award and will include mentoring and coaching throughout the scholarship period.

Chesterton Cricket Scholarship

George Chesterton was an Old Malvernian who played 47 times for Worcestershire CCC between 1950 and 1957. He was extremely proud of cricket at Malvern and this 13+ scholarship is awarded to the candidate who is considered to be the most talented cricketer.

Rachael Heyhoe Flint Cricket Scholarship

Rachael Heyhoe Flint captained England from 1966-1978 and played for England for 22 years. She was the first female member to be admitted to the MCC and later became a committee member. It is a great honour to be able to award this scholarship, which carries her name, to a very talented female cricketer entering Malvern College in Year 9.

Sports Scholarship 16+

Expectations of Award Holders

- Commitment to the sporting programme throughout all three terms. This includes periods of study leave and during school holidays (if applicable).
- Lead by example and be a good role model for peers.
- Attend at least one Strength & Conditioning a week and mentoring session.
- Communicate any non-attendance or non-availability in advance and in the right manor for fixtures or any session.
- Respond well to guidance, work well in a team and demonstrate good leadership skills, whether by example or captaincy.
- Conduct in competition and in training should be of the highest order.

Malvern College has an enviable sporting pedigree and with many past pupils going on to play professional sport. We boast superb facilities and coaching across all sports and offer a range of awards.

16+ Sports Scholarship for boys and girls with excellent sporting potential

All Sports Scholars are expected to be fully committed to sport at the College and to exercise leadership skills wherever possible both on and off the field of play. They will be excellent role models for all Malvern College pupils and will also demonstrate the highest level of sportsmanship. It is expected that Sports Scholars will show a sustained commitment to sport throughout their time at the College.

Candidates at 16+ will be playing sport to a very good level within their age group (be that at county or regional level or within an Academy). It is recognised that 16+ scholars will be looking to balance their academic studies and all that Malvern College has to offer alongside their commitment and focus upon developing themselves in their chosen sport. We therefore provide mentoring and coaching to ensure pupils are able to work towards achieving their goals.

Assessments will comprise:

- an interview with either the Director of Sport or the Head of the Sport
- a core movement skills and fitness assessment
- a technical skills assessment
- a training session with the existing teams.

Scholarship Eligibility

- Pupils must be formally registered for entry at Malvern College in order to enter for a scholarship.
- Pupils must complete and pass the required entrance tests prior to sitting 16+ scholarship assessments.
- 16+ scholarships are conditional upon achieving GCSE grades in line with Malvern College entry requirements to the Sixth Form.
- Parents should discuss and agree a scholarship application with the Head of their child's current school prior to completion and return of scholarship forms.
- All scholarships are awarded on merit, and are determined largely by the child's performance in the relevant assessment and interview.
- More than one type of scholarship can be applied for and awarded, although the total fee remission across all awards will be capped at 15%.
- Scholarship application forms must be received at Malvern College before the closing date. Applications received after this date will not be considered.
- All scholarship assessments are held at Malvern College.
- The performance of each scholarship holder is reviewed on an annual basis by the relevant subject Head of Department and Housemaster or Housemistress. Concerns over performance or commitment will be discussed with parents. In exceptional circumstances the award may be withdrawn.

Financial Assistance

Malvern College is proud of its charitable commitment and we work hard to widen access to the school. We therefore use our funding to enable as many young people as possible to benefit from a Malvern College education.

Our non means-tested scholarships will not exceed 10% for a single award, and 15% for multiple awards.

Parents requiring assistance with school fees should apply for a means-tested bursary. In exceptional circumstances bursary awards may cover up to 100% of the school fees plus extras.

Eligibility for financial assistance is based upon an assessment of both parents' income and assets.

Bursary awards are made by the Bursary Committee, comprising of the Headmaster, Chief Operating Officer, Finance Director and the Director of Marketing and Admissions.

Some means-tested bursaries are funded by our Foundation through the generous support of donors; if your child is awarded a named bursary, you will be informed. We may occasionally invite you to share your experience or meet a donor, but participation is entirely voluntary and we will always seek your consent before approaching your child.

A bursary award is reviewed annually and changes may be made to the award value where they have been a change in financial circumstances.

Parents must indicate that they require a bursary award at the time of registration, and they will be invited to complete a confidential Bursary Application Form. We strongly recommend that bursary applications are made well in advance. It is important to note that bursary applications received after the end of January preceding the September start date will only be considered in exceptional circumstances.

Pupils with 13+ or 16+ Drama/Musical Theatre Awards are entitled to one free LAMDA lesson per week throughout their time at Malvern College.

Pupils with 13+ or 16+ Music Awards are entitled to up to two free instrument or voice lessons per week throughout their time at Malvern College. These lessons only apply to instruments/singing being actively pursued at the time of the scholarship assessment.

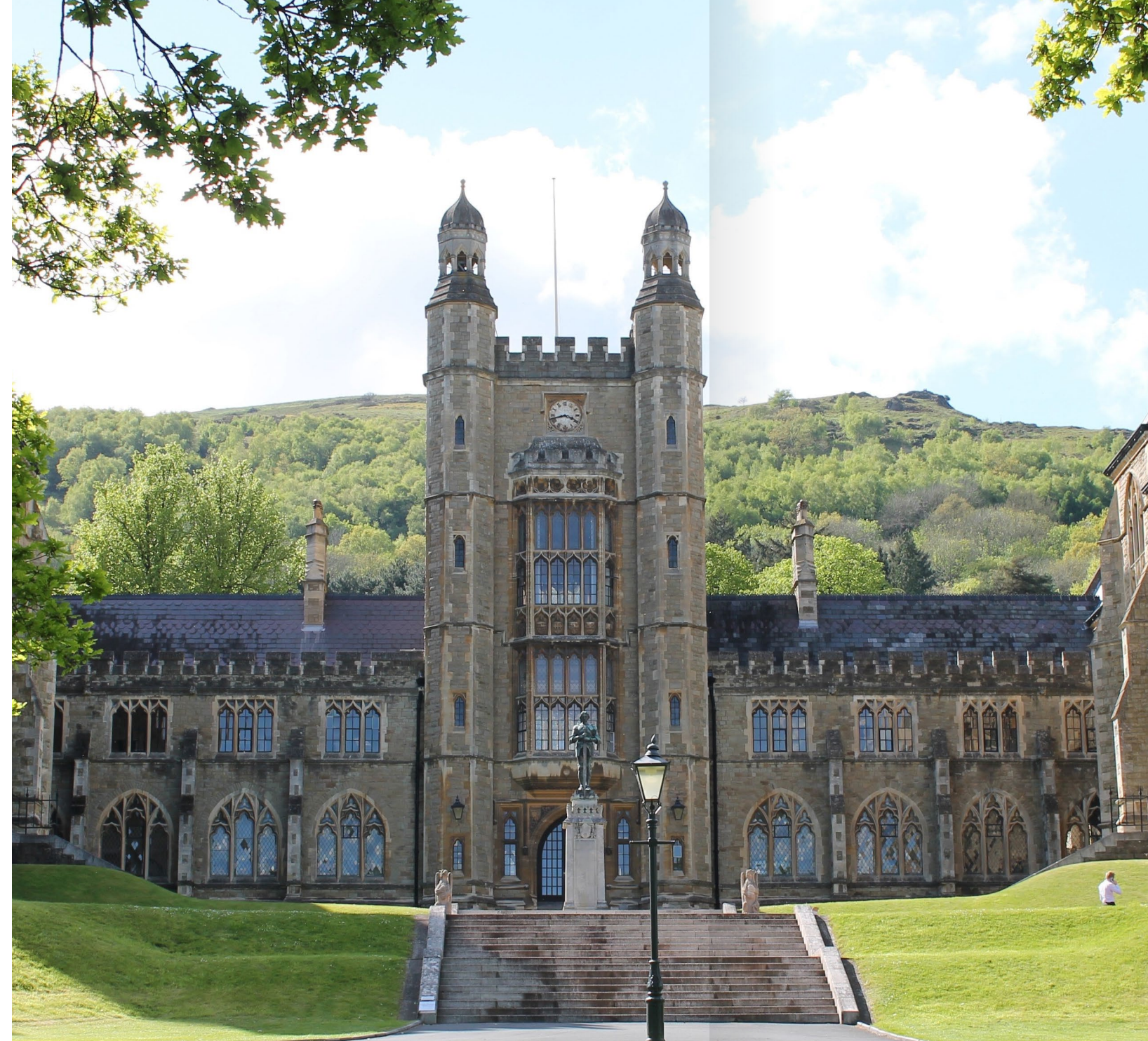
